**Sun at Six: Plume Chair**

This elegant chair employs traditional Chinese joinery, which interlocks rather than using nails or screws to assemble the parts. Leather swaths—which will develop a handsome patina over time—form the seat and back.



**Bend Goods: Cono Copper Table**

A sort of balancing act, Cono resembles a postmodernism sculpture, but it's actually a side table in on-trend copper—with the tray tabletop sitting on the tip of a cone. The opacity of the top and see-through wire base enhance the effect.
